- Taking the initiative to contact your College Admissions Consulting Associate as you have questions or need to schedule a session
- Following the recommendations of your College admissions Consulting Associate to the extent practicable
- Finishing application work and other assigned work in a timely fashion
- Staying abreast of deadlines: You are ultimately responsible for meeting the deadlines associated with testing, completing applications, and requesting letters and transcripts from your school personnel
- Being on time for sessions, and giving 24 hour notice if you will have to miss an appointment
- Having "to do lists" completed by the assigned due dates
- Writing original essays or personal statements
- Completing your own college and scholarship applications
- Checking your e-mail on a weekly basis
