Admission, Testing & Scholarship Deadlines



EARLY DECISION (ED)

- Binding, commits you to attend if admitted; receive decision by mid-December; at highly competitive colleges, admit rate is slightly higher in ED pool
- Example: Dartmouth (Nov 1 app deadline; Nov testing deadline)

RESTRICTIVE (AKA SINGLE-CHOICE) EARLY ACTION

- Does not commit you to attend if admitted, but restricts you from applying EA or ED to other colleges
- Example: Stanford (Nov 1 app deadline; Oct testing deadline)

ROLLING ADMISSIONS

- Apps processed (and decisions sent) as they are received; generally advantageous to apply as early as able (with a quality application)
- Examples: University of Pittsburgh (no specific deadline, though programs enroll to capacity rapidly); UAA (rolling until June 15)

EARLY ACTION (EA)

- Non-binding, allows you to apply to multiple colleges EA; receive decision by mid-December; may be differed to Regular Decision applicant pool
- Example: Lewis & Clark (Nov 1 app deadline; Oct testing deadline)

REGULAR DECISION

- Latest available deadline among application types; if deadline is January or later, fall semester senior year grades will be considered; receive decisions March-April
- Examples: Stanford (Jan 2 app deadline; Jan testing deadline); University of Michigan (Feb 1 app and test score arrival deadline)

TESTING & SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINES

- Scores from the SAT/ACT test dates in October of your senior year will meet the admissions deadlines for all colleges.
- Beyond October, you need to check the admissions deadlines at each college, and dependent on how you are applying, you will need to plan accordingly to take your SAT/ACT/SAT Subject Tests on time.
- For the Alaska Performance Scholarship: You must sit for the SAT/ACT such that your high school receives the scores before your high school graduation date, with some exceptions (contact your high school registrar or the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education for details).
- Keep in mind many schools have scholarship (including WUE eligibility) deadlines that are earlier than the regular decision deadline, so it's important to research the financial aid opportunities at each school and identify specific deadlines.
